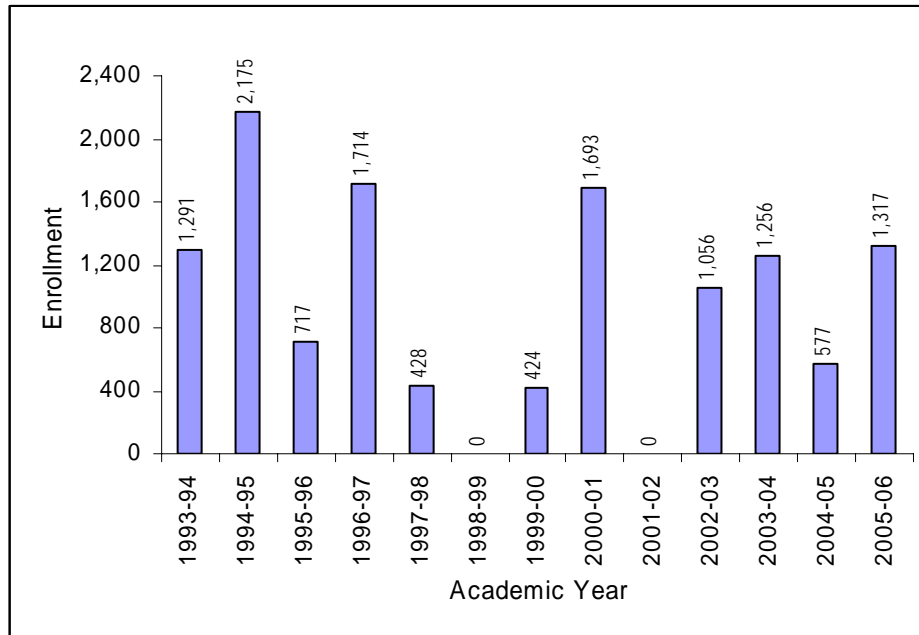

Introduction

This report contains data regarding multicultural and disadvantaged (M/D) precollege activity at UW-Madison occurring from 1993-94 through 2005-06. These data are currently warehoused in the UW System M/D precollege database.

From 1993-94 to 2003-04 these data were collected for a purpose other than providing the type of information presented in this report. Beginning in 2003-04, reporting guidelines and procedures were implemented to facilitate reporting of more accurate and complete information. Later versions of this report will only include the most recent data, including academic years 2003-04 onward.

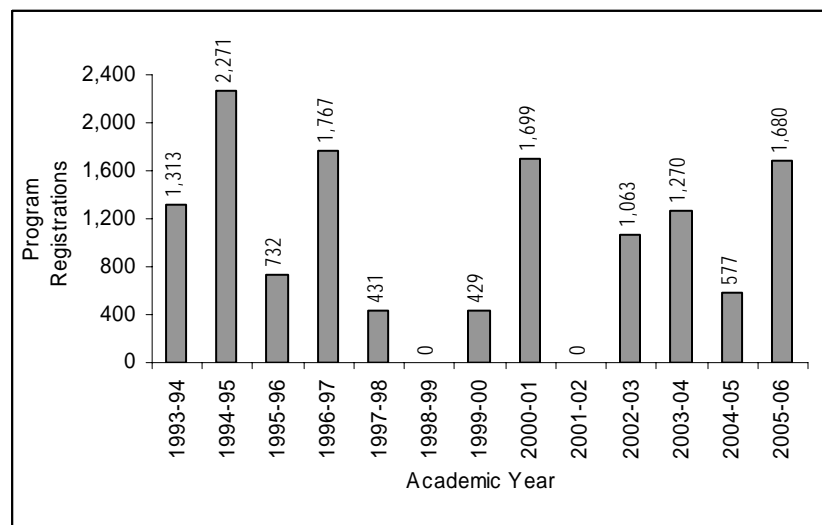
Section I: Participation in UW-Madison M/D Precollege Programming

Registrations

Participant registrations for M/D precollege programs at UW-Madison reported to the UW System M/D precollege database have varied from 0 in academic years 1998-99 and 2001-02 to a high of 2,271 in 1994-95. In 2005-06, the most recent complete academic year of data, 1,680 participant registrations were reported.

Counting M/D Precollege Enrollment

UW-Madison M/D precollege program registrations by academic year count each participant once for each M/D program enrolled in during each academic year. In consequence, an individual enrolling in three different M/D programs throughout one academic year would be counted three times, while an individual enrolling in one M/D program during one academic year would be counted once.

The definition of “academic year” used by the UW System M/D precollege database consists of the summer term followed by the fall term, and ends with the spring term. For instance, academic year 2005-06 includes the summer of 2005, fall of 2005, and spring of 2006.

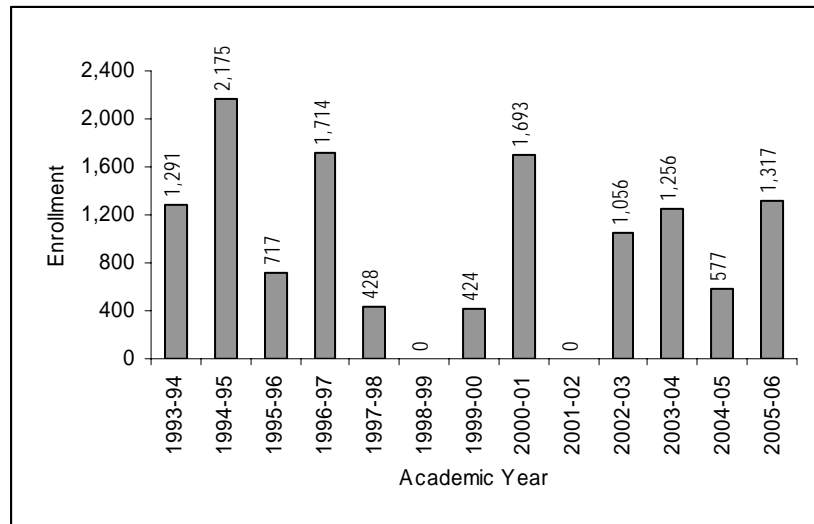
Enrollment: Annual Unduplicated Headcount

The UW-Madison M/D precollege annual unduplicated headcount indicates the number of individuals engaged in M/D precollege activity within an academic year. Unduplicated annual headcount figures do not reflect multiple program registrations by individuals at UW-Madison.

Hereafter, "enrollment" refers to the UW-Madison M/D precollege annual unduplicated headcount. Enrollment in UW-Madison M/D precollege programs has fluctuated from 0 individuals in 1998-99 and 2001-02 to 2,175 in 1994-95. In 2004-05 UW-Madison reached an enrollment level of 1,317, based on data provided to the UW System M/D precollege database. See the appendix for a table showing UW-Madison M/D precollege programs reported during each academic year.

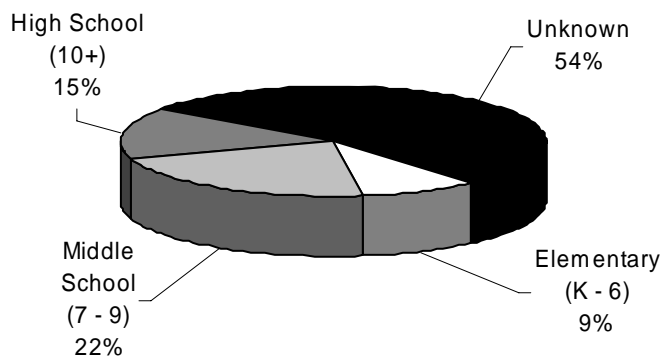
Level in School at Time of Participation

Through the past 13 years, 9 percent of UW-Madison M/D precollege participants were enrolled in elementary school, 22 percent in middle school, and 15 percent in high school. The level in school at the time of participation is unknown for 54 percent of these participants.

Race/Ethnicity

The percentage of M/D precollege participants at UW-Madison who are students of color ranged from 12 percent to 91 percent of annual enrollment over the past 13 years. Through this time period, students of color averaged 41 percent of UW-Madison M/D precollege enrollment.

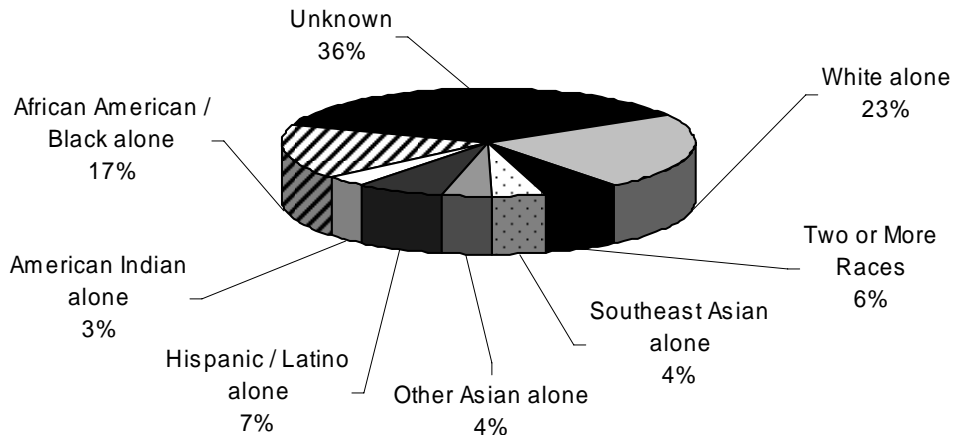
During the 2005-06 academic year, 25 percent of UW-Madison M/D precollege participants described themselves as African American or Black alone. Over the past 13 years, the proportion of African American/Black alone participants ranged between 5 percent and 38 percent, averaging 17 percent.

The proportion of UW-Madison M/D precollege participants indicating their race/ethnicity as encompassing two or more races ranged from a high of 17 percent in the 1999-00 academic year, to 1 percent in the 1994-95 academic year. In 2005-06, 8 percent of UW-Madison M/D precollege participants indicated their race/ethnicity as encompassing two or more races.

Average (1993-94 through 2005-06)



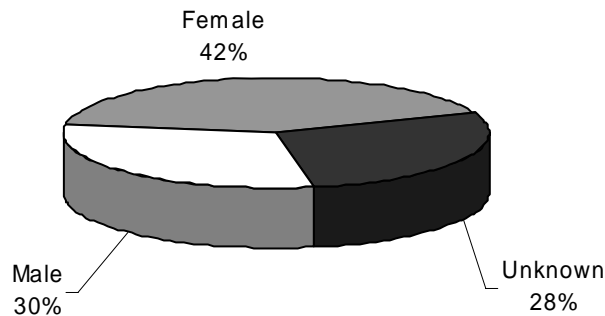
Gender

Through the past 13 years, female participants averaged 42 percent, males averaged 30 percent, and the gender is unknown for 28 percent of UW-Madison M/D precollege enrollment on average.

Race/Ethnicity and Gender

Examination of the average proportion of UW-Madison M/D precollege participants by race and by gender through the past 13 year time period reveals that 10 percent were female and African American/Black alone, 6 percent were male and African American/Black alone, 23 percent were female students of color, and 16 percent were male students of color.

Section II: Higher Education Pipeline - The Path from M/D Precollege to a UW Institution

M/D Precollege Participant Involvement in Higher Education

The path to higher education often includes ACT or SAT test taking, and requires application, admission, and enrollment in an institution of higher education. The Social Security Number (SSN) provides a mechanism to track M/D precollege participants' engagement in these activities. Therefore, an examination of the quality of SSNs in the database provides insight into the ability to measure the proportion of M/D precollege participants engaged in the higher education pipeline.

Increasing the proportion of M/D participants in the database with SSNs will increase the ability to provide information regarding M/D precollege participant success at enrolling in college.

Provision of Social Security Numbers

The completeness and quality of SSN data submitted to the M/D precollege database has varied with each submission and source of data. Several factors may contribute to this. These include M/D precollege participants not providing an SSN, providing an unviable SSN, or entire programs not collecting or submitting SSNs.

Further analysis of M/D participants in the higher education pipeline is limited to 2,555 participants who are estimated high school graduates (based on the grade level at time of most recent participation) and have SSNs in the database. This is the group for whom enrollment in a UW is most likely to occur, and may be measured.

ACT Test Taking

The ACT test taking rate of UW-Madison M/D precollege participants who are estimated high school graduates is 56 percent (see Table 9). The proportion of all 2006 Wisconsin high school graduates that took the ACT is 68 percent.

Ninety-eight percent (98%) of UW-Madison M/D precollege participants were in 11th or 12th grade at the most recent time they took the ACT. Likewise, 95 percent of Wisconsin ACT test takers were in 11th or 12th grade at the time they took the ACT.

The average score for UW-Madison M/D precollege ACT test takers is 23.8. The average ACT score of Wisconsin high school students graduating in 2006 is 22.2.

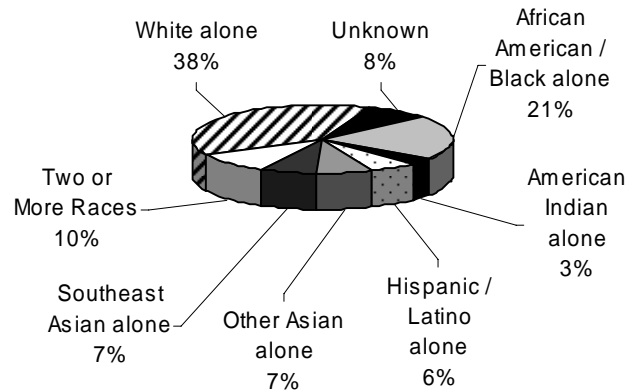

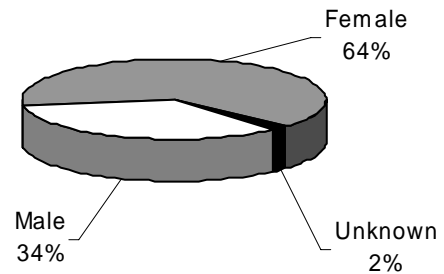

Participants Who Enrolled as New Freshmen in the UW System

By comparing SSNs of M/D precollege participants with SSNs of students enrolled in UW institutions, we may determine how many M/D precollege participants have enrolled in a UW institution as new freshmen. Generating this comparison reveals 904 UW-Madison M/D precollege participants enrolled at some time as new freshmen in UW institutions.

As seen in the shaded *column* of Table 13 below, of the 904 UW-Madison M/D precollege participants enrolled at some time as new freshmen in UW institutions, over half (503 or 56%) were new freshmen at UW-Madison. The remaining 401 UW-Madison M/D precollege participants enrolled at some time as new freshmen in other UW institutions.

UW-Madison enrolled 1,440 new freshmen who once were M/D precollege participants at any UW institution (see shaded *row* in Table 13). This figure includes 937 participants in precollege programs at other UW institutions who then attended UW-Madison as new freshmen and 503 M/D precollege participants from UW-Madison (see Table 13).

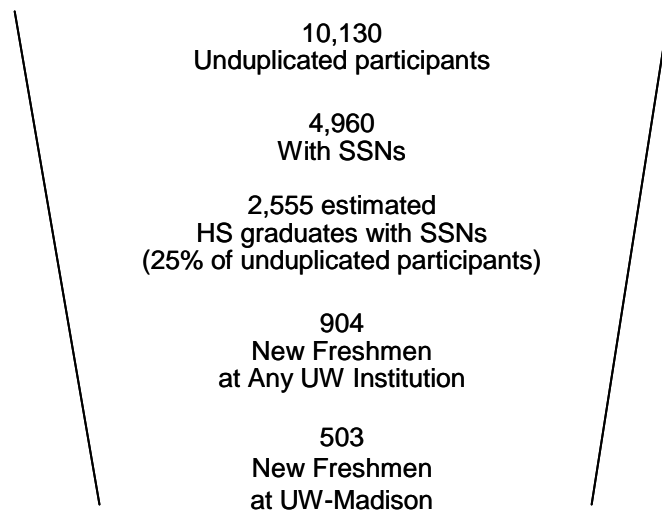

Higher Education Pipeline Summary

The UW System M/D precollege database contains records showing 10,130 unduplicated participants in UW-Madison M/D precollege programs from 1993-94 through 2005-06. There are viable SSNs in the UW System M/D precollege database for about half (4,960 or 49%) of UW-Madison M/D precollege participants. Social Security Numbers provide a mechanism through which ACT test taking and enrollment in a UW institution may be measured.

One quarter (2,555 or 25%) of UW-Madison unduplicated participants are estimated to be high school graduates and have viable SSNs in the UW System M/D precollege database. Of UW-Madison unduplicated participants estimated to be high school graduates with viable SSNs, 904 or 35 percent have enrolled in a UW institution as new freshmen. Over half (503 or 56%) of UW-Madison unduplicated participants who enrolled in a UW institution as new freshmen enrolled at UW-Madison.

Race/Ethnicity of Participants Who Enrolled as New Freshmen in the UW System

Students of color constitute 57 percent of UW-Madison M/D precollege participants enrolled as new freshmen at UW-Madison, and overall 18 percent (89) indicate their race/ethnicity as African American/Black alone.

Among UW-Madison M/D precollege participants who enrolled as new freshmen at any UW institution, about one-fifth (172 or 19%) indicate their race/ethnicity as African American/Black alone and 54 percent are students of color.

1993-94 through 2005-06

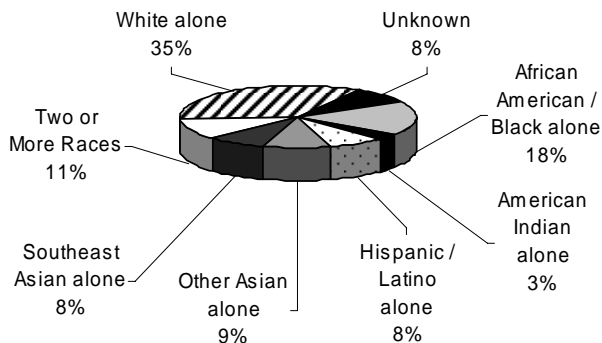
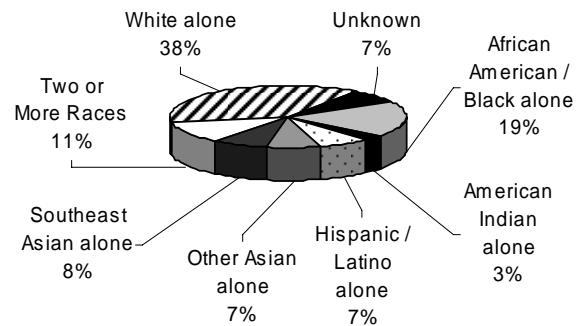

Gender of Participants Who Enrolled as New Freshmen in the UW System

Females compose 64 percent (320) of UW-Madison M/D precollege participants who enrolled at UW-Madison as new freshmen. Likewise, females are 65 percent (586) of UW-Madison M/D precollege participants enrolled as new freshmen at any UW institution.

1993-94 through 2005-06

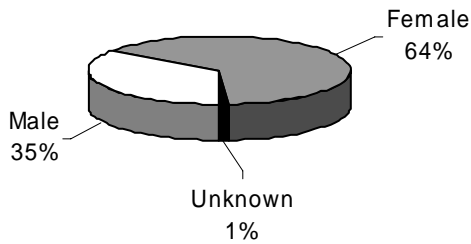
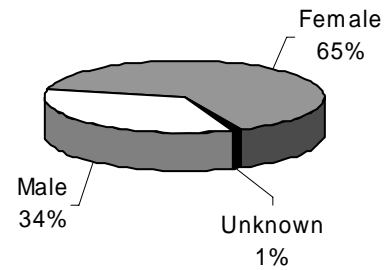

Technical Notes

General

Unless otherwise specified, UW System Administration (UWSA) is the source of the data and information presented in this report. M/D precollege participation data include academic years 1993-94 through 2004-05. Data measuring M/D precollege participants enrolling at UW institutions as new freshmen include academic years 1993-94 through 2005-06.

For the purpose of the UWSA M/D precollege database, “multicultural” includes students of African American, Hispanic/Latino, American Indian, Asian, and Southeast Asian participants. “Disadvantaged” refers to economic disadvantage as defined by eligibility for the National School Lunch Program free or reduced price lunch.

Figures include participants funded through federal, state, and other sources.

During the winter of 2003-04, the UWSA Office of Policy Analysis and Research (OPAR) assumed custodial responsibility for the M/D precollege database. Until the winter of 2003-04, the database was maintained by the UWSA Multicultural Center for Education Excellence (MCEE).

It is possible that not all UW System M/D precollege activity has been provided for each year of data. As campuses increasingly provide complete and accurate data regarding M/D precollege programs and participants, the capacity of the database to analyze the success of UW System M/D precollege efforts will increase.

The definition of “academic year” used by the UW System M/D precollege database consists of the summer term followed by the fall term, and ends with the spring term. For instance, academic year 2004-05 includes the summer of 2004, fall of 2004, and spring of 2005.

Section I: Participation in UW System M/D Precollege Programming

Program Registrations

Precollege program registrations may differ from previous reports due to changes in submission and reporting practices.

Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity

Race/ethnicity “alone” categories indicate that only one race/ethnicity was indicated by the participant. The categorization “Students of Color” includes all students except those who indicated White alone or Unknown.

Section II: Higher Education Pipeline - The Path from M/D Precollege to a UW Institution

Estimate of High School Graduation

For the purpose of this report, high school graduation is determined by viewing participants’ maximum grade level in the database, and how much time has passed since the most recent participation in order to determine if they would be estimated to have graduated from high school.

Enrollment as New Freshmen in the UW System

New freshmen are defined as degree-seeking undergraduates with no creditable coursework in higher education other than credits earned during Summer Session or while in high school.
