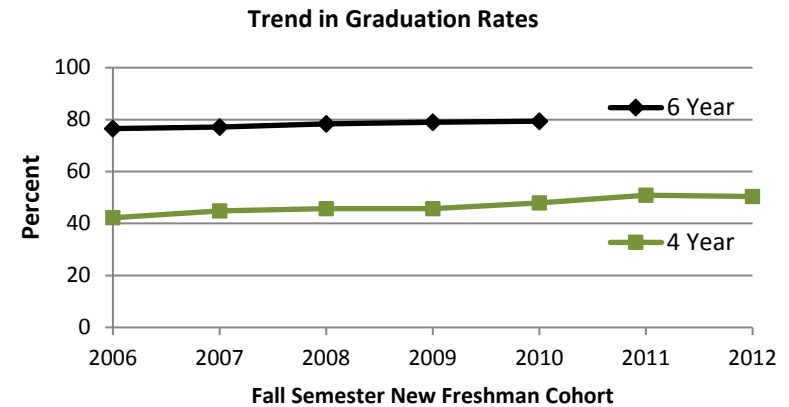
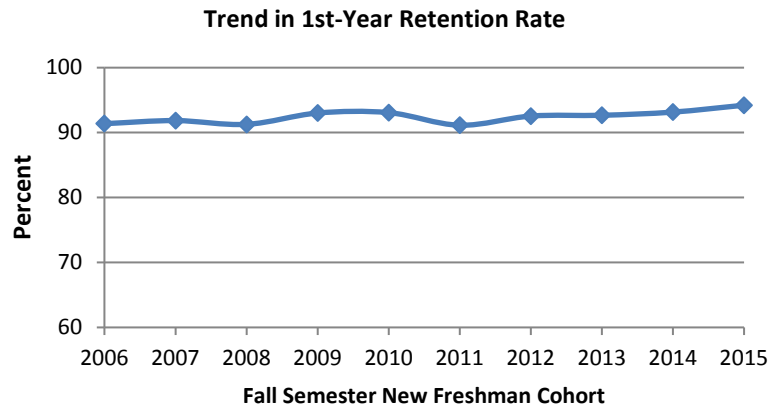

Notes: Fall semester entrance cohorts include new freshmen who enrolled in the fall or in the immediately preceding summer term. Prior to the 2009 cohort, students who entered PharmD, DVM, or MD programs without a bachelors degree were counted as "graduated" when they completed 120 credits. Eligible students are now awarded a milestone bachelors degree and are counted the same way as other graduates.

The term "first generation" means that neither of a student's parents earned a bachelors degree. This question was first asked of undergraduate applicants in Fall 2005.
