Notes: Fall semester new freshmen include those who started in the immediately preceding summer term. 1) The term targeted minority refers to domestic students who are African American, American Indian, Hispanic/Latino(a), or Southeast Asian. 2) The race/ethnic categories in the Diversity section are reported using methodology and in categories required by the U.S. Department of Education. Race/ethnicity is only reported for non-international students. All Hispanic students (regardless of other values reported) are reported as Hispanic. Students who are not Hispanic who report multiple race values are reported as "2 or more races". Everyone else who is not Hispanic is reported in their single race category. Non-targeted Asians include students who reported their race as Asian but are not in one of the targeted Asian categories. 3) The term "first generation" means that neither of a student's parents earned a bachelors degree. 4) The first three financial aid categories are required by the Department of Education. The FASTrack and BANNER programs are UW-Madison programs for very low income students. 4) Military veterans are veterans whose active duty service has been verified by the Office of the Registrar.
