



Notes: Fall semester entrance cohorts include new freshmen who enrolled in the fall or in the immediately preceding summer term. Prior to the 2009 cohort, students who entered PharmD, DVM, or MD programs without a bachelors degree were counted as "graduated" when they completed 120 credits. Eligible students are now awarded a milestone bachelors degree and are counted the same way as other graduates.

*Starting in 2008, the Dept. of Educ. changed the collection and reporting of race/ethnicity. Two new categories were added and students were able to select multiple values. For reporting, students who indicate a Hispanic background are reported as Hispanic (even if other values are reported). Students who are not Hispanic but have multiple race values are reported in the "2 or more races" category. Students who are not Hispanic and report a single race are reported in the single race categories. Prior to 2008, only a single race/ethnic value was collected and used in reporting.
