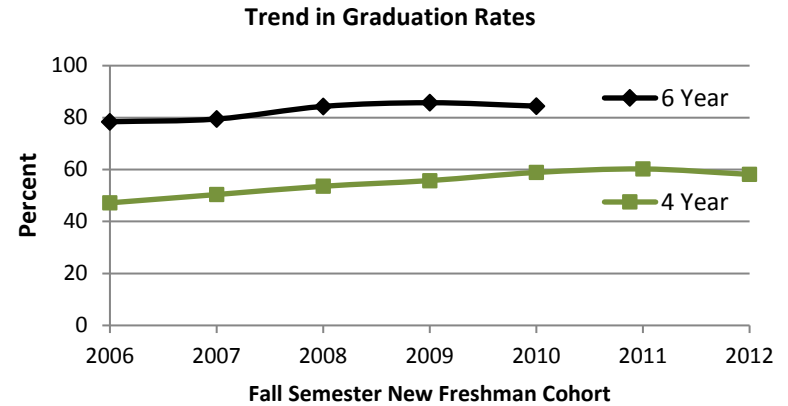
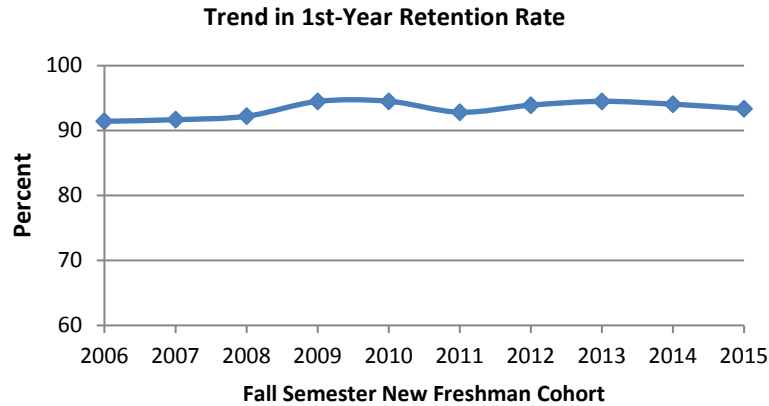

Notes: Fall semester entrance cohorts include new freshmen who enrolled in the fall or in the immediately preceding summer term. Prior to the 2009 cohort, students who entered PharmD, DVM, or MD programs without a bachelors degree were counted as "graduated" when they completed 120 credits. Eligible students are now awarded a milestone bachelors degree and are counted the same way as other graduates.

This tabulation includes new freshmen who received a Federal subsidized Stafford loan in their first semester but were not Pell Grant recipients.
